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LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear FSA Members,

With elective surgical volume approaching pre-pandemic 2019 levels, our professional life appears to be back on track to normality. Preop areas, OR and PACU are buzzing with commotion; caring for COVID affected is now a matter of second nature; our fear of uncertainty has been replaced with the ever-growing body of scientific knowledge shared in the most impressive and unprecedented fashion amongst researchers and clinicians across departments, institutions, healthcare system and in fact nations.

My recent trip to the State Capital, however, brought back the reality of the ongoing pandemic. What is typically a beehive of activity is now a building with empty halls, walkways, elevators, and lobbies. All in-person visits to the legislative buildings are prohibited; testimony is restricted to a video link from an outside building; galleries to witness the democratic process are empty.



Yet, I had an opportunity to meet with prominent Senate and House members shortly before our State Legislature commenced its session on March 2nd, 2021. We discussed openly the ill-suited attempts to further destroy the physician-led care team model and emphasized that the field of anesthesiology does not have an access issue in Florida; that costs would in fact increase for anesthesia care, and that safety is at risk as physician anesthesiologists save seven lives per 1000 anesthetic or surgical complications compared to unsupervised non physician anesthesia providers. I portrayed the misappropriation of physician titles by nonphysicians as a blatant attempt to confuse the public.

The FSA's "Doctor of the Day" program opened another opportunity to demonstrate our value. For this legislative session more than ten anesthesiologists signed up to serve as the primary care doctor for the Florida's House and the Senate. I am grateful for these physicians who took out time from their family and professional life and spent a day in the State Legislature.

On the regulatory side, the FSA with strong support from several state and national organizations submitted patient centered, safe practice proposals for rules regarding pediatric ambulatory surgical center which will soon be allowed to provide overnight care. We are eagerly awaiting a final and amended rule by AHCA to safeguard these most vulnerable, young patients.

As summer arrives, I am optimistic that we will once again, without angst, enjoy what makes us whole as human beings: Meeting up with friends and relatives, sharing laughter and a meal, hugging Oma and Opa. Certainly, our young children are looking forward to it come May when we will visit my mother-in law in South Florida after hiatus of over 14 months.

Keep safe and continue to serve your patients and community to the highest standards.

LOOKING BACK AT PHYSICIAN ANESTHESIOLOGISTS WEEK

JANUARY 31 – FERUARY 6, 2021

Florida celebrated with the rest of the nation in recognizing **Physician Anesthesiologists Week**, Jan. 31 – Feb. 6, 2021. This week highlighted the importance of maintaining physician-led anesthesia care and the role our specialty plays in providing Floridians with safe, high-quality care.

Physician anesthesiologists are guardians of patient safety in health care and make a difference when it matters most — in the operating room, in the delivery room, in the intensive care unit, and pain clinic. During the pandemic, our education and training prepared us to navigate life-and-death moments, as we transitioned from the operating room to the emergency room. Anesthesiology doctors acted as airway management experts and ICU physicians for the sickest of patient diagnosed with COVID-19.

We're proud to be on the front lines and to use our experience, including 12 to 14 years of education and 12,000 to 16,000 hours of clinical training, to combat the pandemic in these critical care situations. And while nurse anesthetists play a valuable role on the anesthesia care team, they only have half the education and 2,500 hours of training and cannot replace a physician.

Laws in 45 states and the District of Columbia require physician involvement for anesthesia care to ensure patient safety. This supervision also is supported by independent research and its elimination would not improve access to care or save medical costs.

Every patient deserves and wants the highest quality care from a physician when it matters most.

The duties of the committee include addressing issues that affect members' professional development and career satisfaction, and to promote an environment that encourages personal well-being and contentment as caring physicians, productive professionals and responsible family members.

Call for Proposals:

The ASA Committee on Professional Diversity's annual call for proposals for the ASA Mentoring Grant Program is now open. The goal of this grant is to foster diversity within ASA through mentorship. The program provides funding up to \$5,000 to mentor/mentee pairs who submit a project that addresses the goals of the Committee on Professional Diversity. The project may be oriented to research, education, political advocacy or an organized medicine endeavor that clearly speaks to the mission and duties of the ASA Committee on Professional Diversity.

The matched mentee/mentor pair should submit their application form, individual curricula vitae and a 1-2 page description of their project to the ASA Committee on Professional Diversity via the web portal. The deadline for the 2021 grant is Wednesday, June 30, 2021. The submission should include:

- A *detailed* description of the project's objective along with an explanation of how it will enhance the professional growth and leadership potential of the mentee.
- A designation of the length of time, required equipment/supplies, travel, meetings and requested funding; also include co-funding provided by the home institution of record in support of the project chosen by the mentee/mentor, if any. No electronic equipment such as computers or tablets may be included in the budget. The grant does not cover operational expenses, institutional or grant administrative costs, food, or beverage. Total budget should not exceed \$5,000.
- Potential barriers to the completion of the grant.
- Description of how this project speaks to the mission and duties of the ASA Committee on Professional Diversity.

Both the mentor and mentee must be active members of ASA and their state component society at the time of submission of their application.

Timeline

For 2021 applicants, the committee will review all submissions and notify the mentor/mentee pairs of potential funding status and support of the project by August 7, 2021. Funding to grant recipients will be distributed via mailed check after the ANESTHESIOLOGY® 2021 annual meeting. A one-page written update of the progress of the project will be due June 30, 2022.

Mentees are expected to give a **one-slide**, **five-minute presentation** at the Committee on Professional Diversity reception at the ANESTHESIOLOGY® annual meeting upon completion of their project at ANESTHESIOLOGY® 2022. If attendance is possible, mentees are also encouraged to give a brief overview of their project at this same event at ANESTHESIOLOGY® 2021.
