## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

2021 has been a challenging year for our specialty. After facing Delta and now Omicron, our Executive and Legislative Committees as well as our marketing and legislative team continue preparing for a 2022 Legislative session.

American Society of Anesthesiologists, American College of Emergency Physicians, and American College of Radiology <u>File Lawsuit Against the Federal Government's Implementation Rules for "No Surprises Act."</u>

**The Florida Society of Anesthesiologists** has joined the Texas Medical Association (TMA) and their recently filed lawsuit regarding the flawed No Surprises Act (NSA) regulation implementing the independent dispute resolution (IDR) process.

Nurse Anesthetists have introduced two bills, seeking the elimination of physician supervision, and elimination of protocols by facility medical staff. Our leadership and legislative team have been working to keep Anesthesiologist led care in

Florida. Our next board of directors meeting, as well as legislative visits will be in Tallahassee, this coming January 2022. Help support our efforts by donating to the Florida Society of Anesthesiologists Political Action Committee.

Florida Association of Anesthesiology Assistants seeking to update the statue that rules their profession to better match their abilities to practice under Medical Direction in the State of Florida, when the physician is immediately available.

### **FSA AND FMA** (continued from page 1)

The Florida Society of Anesthesiologists and the Florida Medical Association have solidified our relations, not only at the FMA annual meeting, and by having an Anesthesiologist Dr. Chuck Chase in the FMA leadership, but also from the Legislative Agenda. By supporting its other's legislative agenda, we maintain patient safety in Florida.

- 1. **Scope of practice expansion**, the FMA is in full support of the FSA preventing independent practice by Nurse Anesthetists.
- 2. The FMA and FSA continue working together on enhancing the Truth in Medical Education act, or TIME act. Many professionals continue to misrepresent their education to confuse patients into thinking they are physicians. For example, nurse anesthetists, attempt to call themselves nurse anesthesiologists, there are professionals calling themselves nurse cardiologist, nurse dermatologist, etc. The proposed legislation would empower the Florida Department of Health, and not the Board of Nursing to manage these outliers.
- 3. Clarification of the parental bill of rights. FMA is seeking a clarification of the Parental Bill of rights. FMA is seeking a fix to the bill to exempt physicians of liability if they aid a minor after an accident, or other event, and they don't have parental presence to avoid criminal penalties.
- 4. **Telehealth**: the FMA is seeking to expand the capabilities to prescribe controlled substances, after a telehealth visit, as many patients have suffered during the COVID pandemic, by being unable to visit physician offices. In addition, insurance companies are attempting to pay less for telehealth services that have been very important during the pandemic. If we don't get this, patients in rural areas would be impacted.
- 5. **Medication access for cancer patients**. The FMA wants to improve patients access to cancer drugs. "White bagging" means the drug is purchased through a specialty pharmacy and shipped to the provider's office for administration. Should the FMA be unsuccessful, physicians will lose the ability to adjust treatment based on a patient's condition, or treatments could be delayed.
- 6. **School "bleeding control kits:"** The FMA and FSA are seeking funding from the legislature for the "Bleeding control kits" for schools in Florida. This is a way to prevent tragic deaths in schools.
- 7. **School loan reimbursement for physicians** who work in rural areas.

# ASA's Anesthesiology Policy Research Rotation in Political Affairs

#### NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS

The American Society of Anesthesiologists is excited to announce that applications are now open for the 2022-2023 cycle of the **ASA Anesthesiology Policy Research Rotation in Political Affairs**, also known as the "**Resident Scholar Program**." The ASA Advocacy Division hosts a four-week rotation in Washington, D.C., designed to allow resident physicians to experience the political, legislative, and regulatory factors that affect the delivery of patient care.

During the rotation, the resident will achieve comprehensive understanding of health care politics and policy, gain first-hand experience of a political environment, assist in day-to-day activities in ASA's Advocacy Division, attend lobby events sponsored by ASA, create specific research projects, and explore and report on new law and policy changes affecting the profession of anesthesiology. During the rotation the resident will be supervised by ASA's Director of Congressional and Political Affairs.

Please note: In accordance with CDC guidance for businesses and employers to slow transmission, and to prioritize the health and well-being of ASA staff and its members, ASA employees are working remotely and abiding by state and local guidelines. We look forward to the Rotation returning to an in-person experience. However, applicants should be prepared for the rotation to remain virtual until an in-person environment is safe and appropriate.

The Policy Research Rotation in Political Affairs has been approved by the American Board of Anesthesiology (ABA) to count toward residency credit. A stipend of \$5,500 is provided to offset living expenses (note: this stipend will be \$2,500 for virtual participants). The 2022-2023 application period is now open and will close February 16, 2022 at 11:59 PM EST.
