

Activity description:

Optimization of pain control while minimizing side-effects from medications is one of the core elements of enhanced recovery. Infiltration of local anesthetic into tissue planes such as erector spinae plane (ESP), rectus sheath, and chest wall muscle planes (PECS 1, 2 and serratus) are becoming increasingly popular and have been shown to provide enhanced analgesia for abdominal and breast procedures.

Similarly, same-day joint replacement is becoming a new standard for knee and hip replacement. Targeted ultrasound-guided infiltration of the knee and hip via pericapsular nerve group (PENG) block, genicular nerve infiltration, and posterior capsule infiltration (iPACK) are novel motor-sparing techniques that provides high-quality analgesia with accelerated mobility and functional recovery.

At this hands-on workshop, participants will learn the indications, sonoanatomy and techniques for performing these ultrasound-guided infiltration procedures. This 2-hour session will incorporate didactic lectures, hands-on scanning of live models and technique practice with high-fidelity anatomical gel phantom models.

At the conclusion of this session, the participants will be able to:

- » Discuss the rational use of targeted ultrasound guided knee and hip blocks for orthopedic patients with a focus on same-day discharge.
- » Describe the indications, strengths and limitations for various fascial plane blocks of the chest wall and abdomen.
- » Design a comprehensive, balanced pain management plan that minimizes opioid-related adverse effects and facilitates rapid recovery from surgery and anesthesia.






